Dr. Pelino earned his Doctor of Optometry degree from the Pennsylvania College of Optometry in 1994, and completed his residency training with an emphasis on ocular disease at the John F. Kennedy Memorial Hospital in Philadelphia. Following his residency, Dr. Pelino completed a clinical fellowship in vitreo-retinal diseases.

Dining with Diabetes Fall 2015 Program

The Eye Institute's (TEI) second Dining with Diabetes program is set to begin on Thursday, October 22nd. Dining with Diabetes is a free five-week program offered by Penn State Cooperative Extension in conjunction with The Eye Institute. The goal of this program is to help patients understand the most important aspects about managing diabetes.

Registered Dietitians and Certified Diabetes Educators will lead discussions regarding crucial numbers to know, planning and preparing healthy meals, and the importance of physical activity. Lab tests will be offered to measure hbA1c values (blood sugar levels).

Classes will be held from 9:30-11:30 am on Thursdays starting on October 22nd, and ending on November 19th. A follow-up class is scheduled for January 28th.
