Rock Painting - Bugs!

Rock painting targets many skills in a fun and engaging way! This activity provides tactile sensory input by finding a rock within your environment, washing it off and painting it.

It also promotes a more functional and dynamic grasp pattern by painting a smaller surface area. Working on these skills supports development of fine motor skills and grasp!



What you'll need:

- Rocks / Stones
- Paint markers / regular markers
- Soap and water
- Paper towels
- Piece of paper

Directions:

- 1. Go on a walk to find a rock outside near your house / backyard.
- 2. Bring inside and wash off with soap and water. Dry completely with paper towels.
- 3. Draw sample bug design on a piece of paper with marker to reference when transferring design onto rock.
- 4. Copy your design onto the rock with paint markers or regular markers.

Ways to increase difficulty:

• Have your child make a more detailed design on your rock that involves dynamic movement (polka dots, small lines, swirls, etc.)

Ways to decrease difficulty:

• Have your child copy your bug design by breaking it down into one step at a time. Your child can imitate each step onto their rock as you draw it on a piece of paper for a visual demonstration.
