Messy Boats

What you will need:

- Storage containers
- Berry Blue Gelatin (about 4 boxes)
- Little boats
- Paper towels
- Dishwashing soap

Directions:

- 1. Follow directions on gelatin boxes to make the "water", let it sit overnight.
 - a. Do this step for your child since it involves boiling water
- 2. Place it in a large container and add the little boats
- 3. Fill a second (smaller) container with dish soap and water, and set the paper towels nearby
- 4. Allow your child to have some messy fun with the boats in the gelatin
 - a. It is a good idea to do this activity outdoors to avoid a mess in your home
- 5. Have your child transfer each boat to the soap container one by one, to help shine them after their 'journey at sea'
- 6. Soak the boats and wipe them dry with the paper towels once they are clean

How to increase difficulty:

- Have your child place the boats inside the gelatin container by lining them up neatly and counting them
- Pinching the boats with their thumb and index finger, your child can steer the boats on a windy path
- Ask your child to help you clean your hands with the paper towels in addition to theirs

How to decrease difficulty:

- Clean your child's hands for them when they are finished playing
- Provide less boats in the gelatin so there are fewer items to clean at the end
